### Assisting Families For The School Year

When my daughter turned six months old, she already understood the importance of that black rectangular object with which her parents always seem to be so enthralled. In fact, only shortly after her half birthday, she began to take our phones and pretend to scroll through them, flicking her thumb up and down the screen. At two years old, she refused to allow us to choose which T.V. shows she watched and started scrolling through the kid's section herself, sometimes selecting ones she already loved, sometimes choosing shows that seemed interesting, based solely on the Netflix photo.

The irony of technology is, of course, that we don't want our children to spend too much time on the phone, iPad or computer, yet we definitely need them to spend time on the phone, iPad or computer for fear that they will be left behind technologically from their peers.

Balance and moderation remain the two key words in this discussion, as they remain so in almost every Jewish dispute ever debated. Maimonides himself tells us that we should not be over righteous in our lives, and instead choose to balance what we eat and even the amount we envy. He teaches us that too much of a good thing, be it eating healthy food, volunteering our time, or donating our money may well be considered the wrong choice, a means to follow the path of the sinner.

As we watch the changes in the world unfold, we all realize the balance in our use of technology will become an even more hotly debated subject, as our children navigate the balance between virtual and on campus learning. How much time on a particular device will be too much for them, or too little, will be the hotly

contested contest in my household for the next 17 years.

Every year the High Holidays remind us that we require balance in every aspect of our lives. Whenever the scale tips too far to one side, we spend the next year tipping it toward the middle. However, this year the technological balance in our community has navigated itself to the forefront of our minds, as school districts such as the Savannah-Chatham County Public School District, move towards online learning. Never before has the discrepancy between the technologically capable and incapable been more apparent. Whereas before, I might find myself at a disadvantage without a computer and access to Wi-Fi at home, now I will find myself unable to even go to school.

As we begin our new year and the school year for our students, we seek to find ways to assist families in need. Some houses of worship have given spaces for students to attend virtual school, so that these students will have access to technology. We have decided to help financially by promoting the school district's donation page. # Creativity Flourishes Through Covid

When Covid shut down Synagogues in Savannah and throughout the United States in March, the usual way of "doing business" came to a halt. Congregations quickly pivoted to virtual classes and services utilizing zoom, YouTube and Facebook. Many Synagogues had been streaming services prior to 2020, but now it has become imperative for all to get on board the virtual train.

So, how has it gone? For Agudath Achim, B'nai Brith Jacob, and Mickve Israel, all three have fared well. Agudath Achim has maintained daily services through Facebook and streamed services and classes via zoom and has recently implemented a YouTube page. BBJ has adapted to social distancing guidelines, to all attendees wearing masks, as well as providing classes via audio and video on their website and on YouTube. Mickve Israel is utilizing zoom and YouTube for classes and Friday night services and is streaming all Saturday services on YouTube.

For our Savannah congregations, the availability of online classes and services has opened up an opportunity for participation amongst those who, prior to the shutdown, were not able to come to the Synagogue due to limited mobility or health reasons. The accessibility of local online Judaic classes has resulted in an uptick in participation. Though people prefer to be together in the same space for learning, fitting a class into a tight schedule certainly is easier when you can attend from home. All the major Jewish denominations are helping their congregations navigate this very unusual year. The Conservative, Orthodox, Reform and Reconstructionist movements have extensive guidelines and resources for their synagogue leaders to utilize and each denominational website features educational and spiritual content for all to access.

What's happening throughout the rest of the Jewish world? Jew It at Home (jewitathome.com) is a "Global Jewish Community" that developed right after Covid began. It was created by Temple Emanuel of Beverly Hills as a global "farmer's market" of Jewish syna-

gogues, non-profits and now includes organizations that span the globe. With a weekly calendar of live educational, spiritual and entertainment events, the site makes it possible to expand your Jewish horizons. Jewish Together (jewishtogether.org) is a "virtual community and informative resources" developed by the Jewish Federations of North America. The site features Summer experiences (summer 5780.org) for kids, teenagers, young adults, and post-college adults, with a variety of formats (fellowship, classes, camp, one-time and recorded) and content from learning & spirituality to arts & cooking and Israel & Hebrew. It also includes "virtual meetups" where you can join in on timely topical conversations, access curated resources to help with personal, emotional, and spiritual well-being and resources to engage in Racial Justice. Last but not least, our very own Stay Connected platform accessible through the savannahjea.org website has links to Jewish Arts, Education and Cultural sites including Harvard's "Judaism Through Its Scriptures" course, the Museum of the Jewish People in Israel, the Jewish Partisan Educational Foundation, Israeli Theatres and performances and Jewish Film Festival links from around the world.

The Covid pandemic has certainly caused irreparable harm but it's also forced our Savannah Jewish community and the Jewish community nationally and internationally to become very creative and collaborative. The Jewish world has been historically very community based. Access to Jewish religious, educational and cultural content was largely determined by your location. Small communities had limited offerings and large cities had a plethora of offerings to choose from. Now, partnerships amongst once competitors have developed to bring Jewish worship, learning and entertainment out of community silos, onto online platforms and into our homes. If there's something good that's come out of this difficult time, it's this ever increasing access to Jewish content that will enable us all to engage with Judaism in ways that are meaningful to us.
